Dr. Jennifer Arnold, M.D., M.Sc., is the medical director of the Pediatric Simulation Center and an assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine. She was trained in resuscitative medicine and simulation education at the University of Pittsburgh's Peter M. Winter Simulation, Education, and Research Center and within the Safar Center for Resuscitative Medicine as a National Institutes of Health Postdoctoral Scholar.

She received her medical degree from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, following which she completed her pediatric residency and neonatal-perinatal medicine fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. She obtained a Masters of Science degree in medical education from the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Arnold received the Ray E. Helfer Award for Innovation in Medical Education from the Academic Pediatric Association for her research in simulation education, and she has spoken both nationally and internationally on simulation research. Dr. Arnold will focus on developing curriculums for the Simulation Center.
